- -What is it about a group that makes them benevolent?
- -What is it about a group that makes them stingy?
- -How can we (Bridges) become more giving as a community?
- -Describe what Paul was referring to when he said that he sought "the fruit that increases to your credit."
- -Think about and then share a time when someone sacrificed for you· How did that make you feel? (18)
- -What is Paul telling them about God's supply in verse 19?
- -What happens in your life that causes you to doubt verse 19?
- -How does giving and receiving help you to "choose joy?" earned from this series?
- -What is one principle you want to really remember and continue to apply from this series on Philippians?
